

In re BNT Services, Inc. d/b/a BNT Impact Windows and Doors

United States Bankruptcy Court, Southern District of Florida

Case No. 26-19877-CAP Chapter 7

On July 27, 2026, BNT Services, Inc. d/b/a BNT Impact Windows and Doors ("BNT" or the "Debtor") filed for protection under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of Florida. On September 1, 2026, the Bankruptcy Court determined that BNT was no longer a viable business and converted this case to a case under Chapter 7 of the Bankruptcy Code. As a result, BNT is now closed and is no longer operating.

Sonya Salkin Slott has now been appointed by the Bankruptcy Court as the Chapter 7 Trustee in charge of collecting and liquidating BNT's assets for distribution to creditors in accordance with the provisions of the Bankruptcy Code. Prior to her appointment, the Trustee was not affiliated with BNT in any way and is not responsible for the acts or omissions of BNT prior to the bankruptcy filing. She will be investigating those acts and omissions in an effort to produce additional recoveries for the benefit of creditors.

Meeting of Creditors (341 Meeting)

The Meeting of Creditors, commonly referred to as the "341 Meeting," is scheduled as follows:

- **Date:** October 14, 2026
- **Time:** 8:30 AM (Eastern)

The meeting may be continued or adjourned to a later date. If so, the updated date will be posted on the court docket and on this website.

Creditors are permitted but not required to attend this meeting. If you are a creditor and choose not to attend, your rights are not affected, but you must still file a proof of claim by the deadline below in order to be eligible for any distribution.

Proof of Claim Deadline

The Bankruptcy Court has established the following deadlines for filing proofs of claim:

- **All creditors (except governmental units):** November 12, 2026
- **Governmental units:** March 2, 2027

What is a Proof of Claim? A proof of claim is a signed, written statement that describes the amount and basis of a creditor's claim against the Debtor. If you believe that BNT owes you money — whether for services not performed, products not delivered, deposits not returned, warranty obligations, or any other reason — you should file a proof of claim.

Why should I file? If you do not file a proof of claim by the applicable deadline, you may not receive any payment from the bankruptcy estate, even if your claim is listed in the Debtor's records.

How do I file? Proofs of claim must be filed with the Court (not with the Trustee) in one of the following ways:

1. **Electronically** through the court's electronic claims filing program at www.flsb.uscourts.gov.
2. **By mail or in person** to the Clerk of Court at: Clerk of the Bankruptcy Court Federal Building 299 E. Broward Boulevard, Room 112 Fort Lauderdale, FL 33301

A blank proof of claim form (Official Form 410) may be obtained at www.flsb.uscourts.gov or at any bankruptcy clerk's office.

Information for Consumers and Customers

If you are a customer who purchased windows, doors, or related products or services from BNT Impact Windows and Doors, please read the following information carefully.

What does this bankruptcy mean for me? When a company files for Chapter 7 bankruptcy, it means the company has ceased operations and its remaining assets will be collected and sold by the Trustee. The proceeds from those sales are then distributed to creditors — including customers like you — in the order of priority established by the Bankruptcy Code.

What about my order, deposit, or warranty? Unfortunately, because BNT is no longer operating and is in liquidation, the Trustee and the bankruptcy estate will be unable to complete any pending orders, installations, or repairs, or honor any existing warranties. If you paid a deposit for work that was never completed, or if you have a warranty claim or other financial loss resulting from your dealings with BNT, you may file a proof of claim as described above to be considered for a distribution from the bankruptcy estate.

Will I receive money? We cannot predict at this time whether, when, or how much any individual creditor may receive. Distributions depend on the total value of assets collected by the Trustee, the total amount of claims filed, and the priorities established under the Bankruptcy Code. We will not know the answers to these questions until all assets have been collected, all claims have been reviewed, and the administration of the estate is complete.

What should I do now? The most important step you can take is to **file a proof of claim before November 12, 2026**. Instructions for filing are provided above.

Updates

The Trustee will update this notice on a regular basis as new information becomes available. Please check back periodically for updates regarding the status of the case, claims review, asset administration, and any potential distributions to creditors.
